YMCA Mission

To put Christian principles into practice through programs that build healthy spirit, mind, and body for all.

For Youth Development

The YMCA is the largest childcare provider in Champaign County, caring for more than 300 children each weekday.

- Daycare Center with 2-Star accreditation from State of Ohio Step Up to Quality (SUTQ) program
- Full-time childcare for ages 6 weeks – 5 years (infants, toddlers, preschoolers)
- Half-day preschool offered at three locations in Champaign County
- Before and After-school child care for grades K-6 at six sites throughout the county
- School's Day Out – when school closes, the Y opens its doors. Grades K-6
- Summer Day Camps serve more than 150 school-age children each summer
- FREE Babysitting service available while parents are exercising

For Healthy Living

Our fitness, sports, and aquatics programs served more than 500 adults and 600 youth in 2015.

- Wide variety of FREE group exercise classes, such as yoga, Pilates, cardio dance, group cycling, TRX
- 7-week FREE Fit Start program in the Fitness Center as well as personal training
- Progressive swim lessons for children and options for adults; plus open/lap swimming
- YMCA Splash program provides free water safety and swim instruction to youth ages 5 to 12
- Youth sports leagues - basketball, soccer, volleyball, and swim
- Youth fitness - tumbling, jazz and ballet dance, karate, and cheerleading
- Adult sports – basketball leagues, volleyball open gyms, and a standing Pickleball schedule

For Social Responsibility

The Y is an inclusive, cause-driven organization. In 2015, we provided membership financial assistance to more than 300 qualified individuals.

- Invest in Youth scholarship fund insures that Y programs are accessible to everyone
- Family events offered to the community free of charge, averaging 350-450 attendees/event
- Interdenominational Bible Study program
- Virtual Farmer's Market – all locally grown items, order online, pickup at the Y

Community Collaborations

- **Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)** - with Mercy Hospital, the Champaign Health District, and other partners
 - Organizes Passport to Wellness events including Go Red For Women and Healthy Kids Day
 - Coordinates the Community Health Assessment
 - Collaborates on Diabetes Prevention programming
- **Outdoor Environmental Educational Collaborative of Champaign County**—with Urbana University, Cedar Bog, Kiser Lake State Park, Freshwater Farms, Valley View Woodlands, Ohio Caverns and the Champaign County Library
 - Hosted Earth Day event at Kiser Lake State Park in 2015 for over 1,000 second graders from Champaign and Madison Counties
- **Collaboration, Learn, Individualize, Monitor, & Believe program (CLIMB)** - with Madison-Champaign County Educational Service Center, Urbana University, Urbana City Schools, WellSpring, the Champaign County Drug Free Youth Coalition, and Family and Children First Council.
 - Coordinates an after-school and summer enrichment program for 2nd and 3rd graders at Urbana South Elementary. Funded by a 21st Century Community Learning Center grant.
- **Kindergarten Readiness Camp** - with support from the United Way of Clark, Champaign and Madison Counties
 - FREE 2-week camp experience to help prepare at-risk 5-6 year olds to enter kindergarten
- **Inventor's Camp** - with the Champaign County Manufacturers Council
 - Summer Day Camp program, rolled out in 2015, will double enrollment capacity in 2016 to meet demand and serve a wider age group

Our History

- \$5 million facility built in 1998, opened March 8, 1999, debt retired March 2009
- 2007: Began operating summer day camp programming at Camp Shiffer
- 2013: \$170,000 facility renovation to expand childcare program by 28 children
- 2014: \$213,000 in flood repairs—costs covered by property insurance
- 2015: Added handicap-accessible amenities including sidewalk ramps and power doors
- 2016: Permanent shelter house and septic system planned for Camp Shiffer
